With the support of our partners, volunteers and team, we positively impacted 35,000+ lives, including 700+ women across 5 villages. We look forward to another year of purposeful progress.

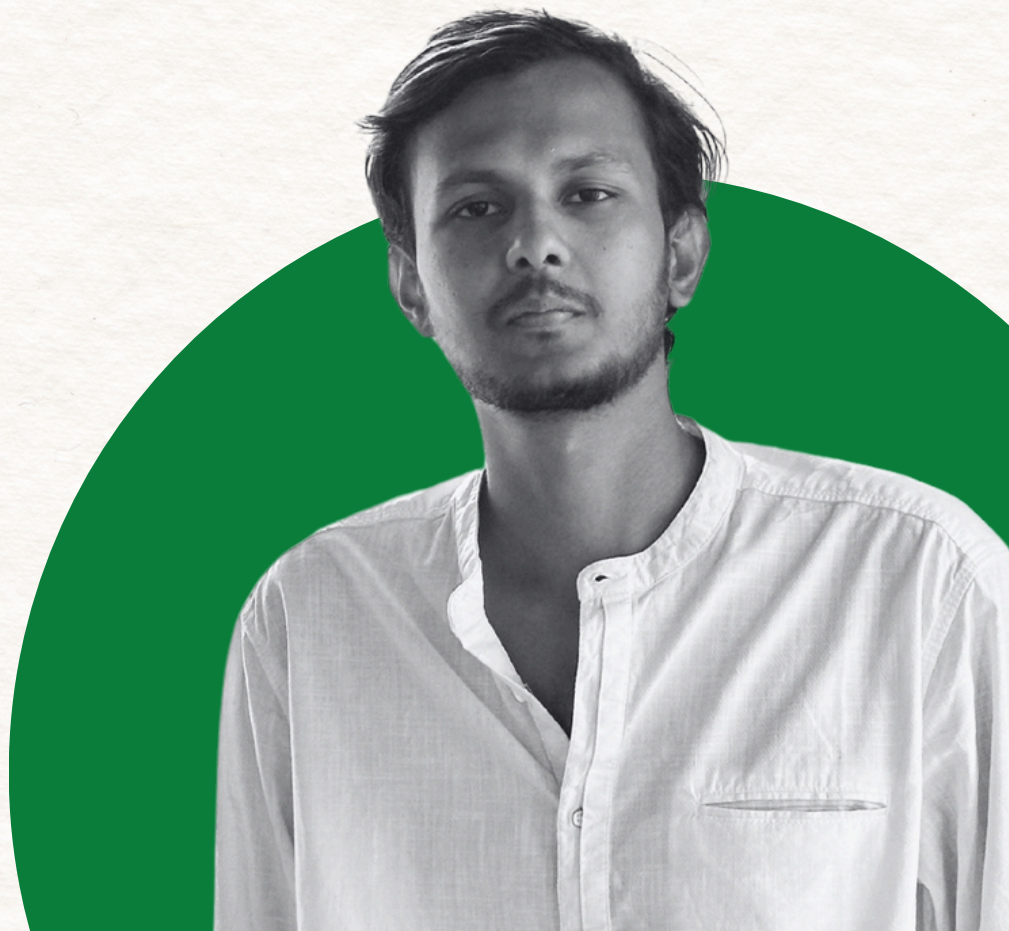

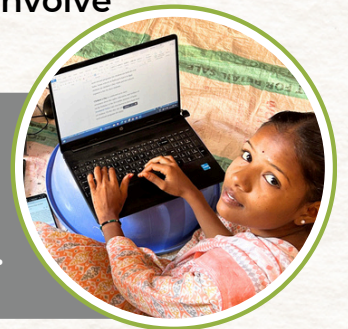


# OUR MISSION

# HISTORY & BACKGROUND

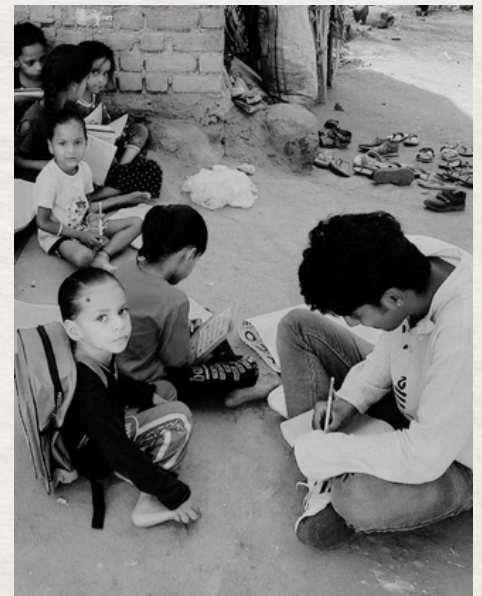
Founded in 2019 by a group of university students in South Rajasthan, the Newage Evolution Foundation is dedicated to empowering women, children, and rural communities. Our mission encompasses digital education, skill development, healthcare, sustainability, sports inclusion, and social awareness, ensuring holistic development for underprivileged communities. Through our four key initiatives—Awareness, Distribution, Digital Education, and Skill Development Sessions—we strive to bridge gaps in access to essential resources and create meaningful, long-lasting change in Udaipur and other locations in Rajasthan. We believe that a better quality of life, education, and opportunities should not be a privilege but a fundamental right. Our awareness campaigns shed light on critical social issues, while our development programs focus on self-reliance, menstrual hygiene education, skill-building, and access to higher education and technical training. As a registered Section 8 company (Newage Evolution Foundation) with 12A, 80G, and CSR-1 certifications, we uphold transparency, ethical governance and credibility in all our operations. While our primary focus is on three tribal villages around Udaipur, we continue to expand our impact across South Rajasthan.



To maximize our outreach, we have partnered with government schools, municipal malls, Udaipur Traffic Police, the Election Commission and MY FM 94.3, organising donation drives, sports distribution programs and large-scale awareness campaigns. We are also proud to collaborate with CaratLane (A Tata Company) under their CSR sports initiative, which focuses on empowering young athletes, providing sports equipment, and developing infrastructure in government schools.

The foundation's journey began in 2019 when a group of university students, deeply moved by the sight of underprivileged children selling fruits near a lake, decided to visit a nearby village. Witnessing the community's struggles with poverty and lack of education, they started weekly visits, distributing nutritious food, offering free education and teaching essential life skills.

Encouraged by the response, they formally established the Aakriti Newage Foundation in 2020, expanding their efforts with education and distribution camps in government schools and organising medical camps in partnership with the Taj Group. In 2021, despite the challenges posed by COVID-19, the foundation introduced skill training programs for tribal women and young girls, focusing on sewing, tote bag making, and creative handicrafts, helping them work toward financial independence.



By 2022, the foundation had expanded its impact to a third village, continuing its education and livelihood programs while generating sustainable revenue from the sale of handmade products. That year also saw the launch of a tree plantation drive, reinforcing our commitment to environmental sustainability.

# HISTORY & BACKGROUND

In 2023, the foundation scaled up its Warmth Project, successfully distributing 1,111 sweaters to those in need. Strengthening partnerships with local FM broadcasters, the Election Commission, and the Traffic Department, we launched youth voting awareness and road safety campaigns. Sustainability became a greater focus, leading to the introduction of eco-printing, a step toward promoting environmentally responsible practices.

From a simple act of kindness to a recognised force for social change, the Aakriti Newage Foundation has come a long way. Yet, our journey has only begun. We remain steadfast in our commitment to creating a more inclusive, empowered, and sustainable future, one community at a time.

# PROGRAMME & ACTIVITIES

## Education

### Why Education Matters

Despite thousands of private and government institutions working in the field of education, a significant gap still exists. The main reasons are the lack of intent and resources.

The Reality of Education in India:

- 1 in 11 children go to work instead of attending school.
- For many families struggling to afford basic needs like food and shelter, education becomes a luxury they must give up.
- 20 million children in India do not attend school due to poverty and inaccessibility.
- Illiteracy leads to further poverty, continuing the cycle of deprivation.

### Aakriti's Contribution to Education

At Aakriti, we focus on providing an education that helps children earn a livelihood while also developing their personalities. During the 2020 pandemic, our innovative E-Teaching and Learning approach helped brighten the future of underprivileged children. Our education programmes have impacted 500 children in various ways. We offer two key programmes:



## 1. Digital Classroom Program

We believe every child deserves a chance to explore the world. Our Digital Classroom Program helps reduce the digital divide by providing:

- Digital Learning
- Interactive Learning
- Skill Development
- Personality Development
- Career Guidance:

## 2. Teach Under a Tree Program

Education should not be confined to classrooms. Our Teach Under a Tree programme, 'Unschooling Model', fosters holistic growth through:

- Creative Expression
- Physical Fitness
- Communication Skills
- Scientific Exploration
- Well-being by focusing on health, nutrition and environmental awareness.
- Life Skills by teaching essential skills for independent & natural living.



## Our Purpose and Impact

Through initiatives like Project Saksham Siksha, our digital classroom programme integrates technology to enhance education by providing enriched learning experiences, personalised and self-paced education and increased accessibility for remote learners. This year, a total of 8 computers were purchased, which were refurbished to enhance their performance. Of these, six computers were donated to adolescents studying in the community village. Additionally, software necessary for effective use, including internet expenses, video and photo editing tools and government exam preparation courses, was also purchased.



## Skills Development

At Aakriti Newage, we believe in the power of skill development to transform lives. Through our Kalakriti skill initiative, we provide hands-on training in various skills, enabling individuals to become financially independent while promoting creativity and sustainability.

### Sewing Machine Training

One of our key programmes is Sewing Machine Training, which equips women and girls above the age of 16 with essential tailoring skills. This programme helps them start their tailoring businesses or secure employment in the garment industry. Our training covers:

- Machine Operation
- Fabric Knowledge
- Stitching Techniques
- Business Skills

So far, we have trained over 220 women and girls across three villages. Many of our graduates have gone on to start their tailoring shops or find employment in garment factories. For instance, in 2023 and 2024, we trained 105 women, and 50% are now earning a steady income through tailoring.



## **Glass Bottle Art**

Our passion for sustainability and creativity is reflected in our Glass Bottle Art Training programme. This initiative not only nurtures artistic talent but also promotes environmental consciousness by repurposing discarded glass bottles. Participants learn to create:

- Decorative Items
- Painting & Designing
- Market-Ready Products

In 2024, we trained 160 women & girls, many of whom now earn a living through their artwork.



## **Digital Skills**

In today's world, digital literacy is essential. Our Digital Skills Training helps bridge the digital divide, particularly in rural areas where access to technology is limited. This programme covers:

- Basic Computer Skills
- Internet & Mobile Use
- Employment Readiness

Over the last three years, we have trained more than 350 individuals, helping many secure jobs or enhance their education

## Upcycled Product Making

Our upcycled product training programme merges creativity, sustainability, and economic empowerment. Participants learn to transform waste materials into valuable products, such as:

- Eco-Friendly Accessories
- Home Décor
- Functional Creations

Through this initiative, we have empowered over 200 women, many of whom sell their creations through the Kalakriti Store. For the last four years, we have been actively involved in upcycling, addressing India's waste management crisis.



# WOMEN EMPOWERMENT



**Health and Hygiene:** At Aakriti Newage, we believe true women's empowerment starts with good health and hygiene. Our mission is to educate and support women and girls in rural Rajasthan through sanitary pad distribution, safety awareness, and reproductive and maternal health initiatives.

In the Udaipur district, we have distributed thousands of sanitary pads and awareness guides over the past four years. Many women still lack access to sanitary products, leading to infections and health issues. Our workshops educate women on menstrual hygiene, dispelling myths and promoting safe practices. We also provide information on reproductive health, family planning, and maternal care, ensuring expecting mothers receive proper nutrition and guidance for a healthy pregnancy.



**Awareness Campaigns:** Issues like early marriage, gender-based violence, and discrimination continue to affect women's lives. Over the past five years, our awareness drives in Udaipur have impacted hundreds of women and helped prevent multiple child marriages.

We educate communities about the dangers of early marriage, the impact of gender violence, and legal rights through workshops, street plays, and discussions. In Rajasthan, where many girls are still married before the legal age and gender-based violence is prevalent, our campaigns aim to change mindsets and empower women with knowledge and confidence.

**Education for Adults:** Education transforms lives at any age. Over the past five years, we have reached 500 women in rural Udaipur through adult literacy programs, helping them learn basic reading, writing and awareness of their rights.

Many women in Rajasthan face restrictions due to social taboos. By providing education and accurate information, we empower them to make informed choices about health, relationships, and economic independence. More women are now seeking education, breaking barriers and contributing to a progressive society.

## Why Awareness Matters

Lack of awareness in key areas such as health, safety, sustainability, digital literacy, voting, and traffic rules leads to risks and missed opportunities. Sustainable practices benefit the environment, while voter education strengthens democracy. NGOs play a crucial role in bridging these knowledge gaps. Society can contribute by volunteering, donating, or spreading information.



**Menstrual Hygiene:** Aakriti Newage plays a vital role in improving menstrual health among rural women and girls in Udaipur. Many face challenges due to a lack of awareness, access to sanitary products, and proper hygiene practices. We address these issues through awareness drives, sanitary pad distribution, and educational workshops in schools and rural areas. Our team also trains local health workers and teachers to continue menstrual hygiene education. Last year alone, we reached over 3,000 women across 10 villages, distributing more than 8,000 sanitary pads and improving knowledge on menstrual health.

**Health & Nutrition:** Ensuring access to healthcare in rural India remains a challenge due to inadequate infrastructure and a lack of medical professionals. Urban slum dwellers also suffer due to limited awareness and financial constraints. Aakriti works to raise awareness about critical health issues, the importance of nutrition, and preventive healthcare. We promote healthy diets, discourage processed foods, and encourage yoga and exercise. We also collaborate with hospitals to organise monthly health camps in rural areas. Till now, we have taken 120+ awareness sessions in schools and rural areas. Our awareness activities include school health camps and community drives.

**Sustainable Practices:** Sustainability is key to social and environmental well-being. Aakriti promotes eco-friendly practices like organic farming, tree planting, and upcycling. Through our Dhara Shringaar drives, we educate communities about native tree planting, rainwater harvesting, and sustainable agriculture. We have trained over 200 farmers and women in sustainable farming, leading to reduced water usage in nearly 20 farms. Upcycling initiatives have provided women with livelihood opportunities while contributing to environmental conservation.



**Women's Safety:** Women in rural areas often face safety concerns, including violence and harassment, with limited awareness of their rights and resources. Aakriti addresses these issues through safety workshops, self-defence training through Lathbaji, and legal awareness programs. We collaborate with local authorities to educate women about legal protections and available support services. Over the past two years, we have conducted workshops in two villages, reaching 500+ women and girls, distributing safety toolkits, and training local volunteers to advocate for women's safety.

**Digital Literacy:** Access to technology is a powerful tool for empowerment. Aakriti's Saksham Shiksha programme provides digital literacy training to rural communities, enabling them to use computers, smartphones, and the internet for education, employment, and access to government services. We have trained over 240 rural children and adults in basic computer skills and online resources. Our mini digital classrooms connect volunteer teachers with rural schools, improving education quality. By bridging the digital divide, we empower communities with the knowledge needed to thrive in a technology-driven world.





**Voting Awareness:** An informed electorate is essential for a strong democracy. Aakriti works to ensure every eligible voter understands the importance of elections. We use street plays to educate communities on voting rights and processes, making information engaging and accessible. In the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, we helped register over 1,500 new voters and conducted awareness campaigns in urban and rural areas. Our efforts encourage higher voter participation, ensuring people make informed decisions, shaping their future.



**Traffic Rules Education:** Road safety is a crucial yet often overlooked issue. Aakriti raises awareness about traffic rules through street plays and collaborations with local traffic authorities. We organise performances at busy intersections to highlight common traffic violations and their consequences, reaching thousands of people. Additionally, we conduct awareness programmes in universities and colleges, educating students on safe driving practices, helmet and seatbelt use, and the legal implications of traffic violations. In the past year, we have reached over 2,000 students, promoting responsible road behaviour and reducing accidents.

# DISTRIBUTION

**Sports Distribution:** At Aakriti Newage Foundation, we believe in the power of sports to transform lives and strengthen communities. Through our "Leveling the Playing Field" project, we distribute sports equipment, provide training, and develop sports infrastructure in government schools across South Rajasthan. To date, we have reached Udaipur, Salumber, Rajsamand, Bhilwara and Chittorgarh districts.

Our initiative includes providing essential sports equipment, alongside developing playgrounds and courts to create safe spaces for students, regional sports upliftment and organising tournaments. We also sponsor sports players. A crucial focus is encouraging girls' participation in sports, ensuring inclusivity. Additionally, we train school sports coaches, equipping them with skills in first aid and effective training methodologies.

In partnership with Caratlane's CSR, we have completed three project phases, benefiting 35,000 students across 100+ government schools in the last 1.5 years.



**Clothes & Sweater Distribution:** Through our "Warmth" project, we provide winter essentials to underprivileged individuals, including children and the elderly. We collect and distribute woollens, sweaters, blankets, and other winter necessities to ensure protection against the cold, focusing on poverty-stricken and tribal areas in Udaipur.

Over the past five years, we have steadily expanded our outreach. In 2022-23, we distributed 1,111 sweaters and blankets, and in 2023-24, we reached a milestone of 2,222 sweaters. We completed our goal for 2024-25 and distributed 3,333 sweaters, which aimed to prevent health issues like hypothermia, which significantly impact vulnerable populations.



**Plant Sapling & Seed Bomb Distribution:** Recognising the importance of trees for a sustainable future, we actively distribute and plant tree saplings and seed bombs to combat deforestation and promote greenery. Our initiatives target areas suffering from high temperatures and environmental degradation.

We engage with local communities, schools, and individuals, providing training on sapling care to ensure their long-term growth. Our seed bomb initiative offers an innovative solution for reforestation in hard-to-reach areas. With a nutrient-rich composition, these bombs facilitate easy germination and regrowth.



**Sanitary Pad Distribution:** Menstrual health and hygiene are essential for women's well-being. Our initiative distributes sanitary pads and educational materials to ensure that menstruation is no longer a taboo and that women have access to necessary hygiene resources.

In rural Rajasthan, many girls rely on unsafe alternatives due to a lack of awareness and resources, leading to health risks and school absenteeism. To address this, we conduct awareness sessions in schools and communities, providing guidance on menstrual hygiene and debunking myths. To date, Aakriti has distributed over 10,000 sanitary pads in Udaipur.



**Shoe Distribution:** Footwear is essential for safety and mobility. Our shoe distribution programme provides new and gently used shoes to students, labourers, and working-class individuals in factories and government schools across Rajasthan.

In many rural areas, the lack of proper footwear results in injuries, infections, and school absenteeism. Similarly, labourers and factory workers face workplace hazards without appropriate shoes. Over the past two years, we have distributed 5,000 pairs of shoes in the Udaipur district alone, significantly improving mobility, hygiene and well-being.



**Stationery Kit & School Furniture Distribution:** A conducive learning environment is essential for quality education. We distribute stationery kits and school furniture to government schools, focusing on under-resourced areas.

Our stationery kits include essential supplies such as notebooks, pens, pencils, and erasers, ensuring students have the tools they need to excel academically. Additionally, in 2023 and 2024, we delivered 350 tables and chairs to schools in the Udaipur district, improving classroom conditions.

Many government schools in Rajasthan lack adequate funding for basic supplies and furniture, leading to lower attendance and engagement.



# SUSTAINABILITY

## Organic Products & Sustainability Workshops

At Aakriti Newage Foundation, we believe in sustainable living and its positive impact on communities. The "Waste to Best" initiative lies at the heart of our efforts, where we transform waste materials into valuable products.

We conduct workshops in city malls and public spaces on topics such as sustainable art, green technologies, and eco-friendly living.

Our training includes:

- Eco-printing clothes using natural dyes
- Upcycling waste materials into useful products such as tote bags, purses, floor mats, and cloth jewellery

Over the past two years, we have trained 300 women and young girls in crafting sustainable products, generating an income of Rs. 1.5 lakh through our Kalakriti Living store. Additionally, more than 1,000 participants have attended our sustainability workshops, guided by trained volunteers and informative sessions.



## Organic Farming & Environmental Education

We promote sustainable agricultural practices that nurture the land, educate the community, and create a greener environment. Organic farming plays a vital role in preserving soil health and ensuring safer, chemical-free food for future generations. Our workshops equip farmers with practical knowledge on transitioning to organic farming methods, helping them reduce dependency on synthetic chemicals.

Our key initiatives include:

- Seed Bomb Distribution & Tree Plantation: 8,000 trees planted in the past three years.
- Plant a Tree on Each Farmland
- Reducing Food Waste

## Leveling the Playing Field

### Project Leveling the Playing Field: A Vision for Sports Empowerment

We launched Project Leveling the Playing Field, a CSR initiative supported by CaratLane – A TATA Product. Our mission is simple yet powerful: to provide underprivileged students with access to proper sports equipment, infrastructure, sponsorships, upliftment and training, fostering a culture of sportsmanship, discipline and excellence.



## Building Infrastructure and Providing Equipment

One of our primary focus areas is sports infrastructure development. From installing football, volleyball, basketball, badminton, and Kho-Kho setups to ensuring proper ground leveling, we have empowered numerous schools with facilities they previously lacked. Through structured training sessions, students not only learn the technicalities of their chosen sports but also develop essential life skills such as teamwork, perseverance and leadership.



## Impactful Initiatives & Success Stories

Through our **on-ground initiatives**, we have successfully developed sports infrastructure across multiple schools. In **Government Upper Primary School, Bandriyo ka Guda, Rajsamand**, we installed **football poles and nets**, providing students with proper training and equipment. In **Government Senior Secondary School, Kunda, Rajsamand**, we distributed essential sports gear, fostering enthusiasm among young athletes. Till now, 100+ government schools have been impacted, and 10+ players have been sponsored and supported. At **Jahawar Vidya Peeth, Udaipur**, where girls showed a special interest in badminton, we installed poles and nets, ensuring they had a platform to hone their skills.

Our efforts go beyond infrastructure. We also **sponsor promising athletes** like **Kapil Choudhary**, a para-athlete from Udaipur who has set state records in the **100m and long jump**, ensuring he receives sports supplements and the best training opportunities. Similarly, our support for **Sonakshi Pandit and Bhavesh**, rising judo stars with JFI-approved judo kits, has enabled her to compete at the state and national levels.



Through this project, two regional Kho-Kho and Lathbaji are being uplifted in urban and rural locations. Students and youths outside the project have also received months of training. Members of the education department, CBO and DO are also involved in this project, which is receiving full support.

## The Road Ahead

Implementing next year, through Project Leveling the Playing Field, we aim to reach 250+ schools, nurturing young talent and reviving indigenous games till the end of 2025. We will also organise sports tournaments this year-end. We are committed to fostering a sports culture that not only develops champions but also instills lifelong values in students. Together, we are shaping a future where every child, regardless of their background, has the chance to dream, play, and succeed.

# Project Warmth

## Project Warmth 3.0: Rs. 3.65 Lakh (Crowdfunding)

Winter mustn't be a dreadful time. Aakriti Newage Foundation's project, Warmth, is a year-long effort to make sure that our community residents who are lacking the necessities, such as warm clothes, sweaters, blankets, etc., can get them during such a time of the year.

This project comes under the distribution drive of the Aakriti Newage Foundation, where all kinds of donations are accepted. For the past 5 years, Aakriti has been distributing these in government schools and tribal, rural and poverty-ridden areas in Udaipur. Under Project Warmth, we distribute sweaters, blankets and other essential winter wear among underprivileged groups in Udaipur and parts of South Rajasthan.

## Project Warmth Highlights

- Successfully distributed 1,111 new sweaters and blankets in the winter of 2023 in the Udaipur district, including to children and the elderly.
- Reached a record of 2,222 sweaters newly distributed in the winter of 2024.

This year, our team reached its goal & distributed 3,333 newly purchased sweaters in the winter of 2025.



# Project Sui Dhaga

has been empowering women for the past three years through skill development and financial independence. By providing sewing training and entrepreneurial guidance, the initiative creates sustainable livelihood opportunities.

With the help of funds, we procured 12 table-fitted sewing machines (both new and second-hand) this year, along with essential materials like cotton fabric, stitching supplies, and printing blocks. In 2024–25 alone, 150 women were trained, producing 1,800 cotton bags and collectively earning ₹1,25,000. Notably, 10 of them have started their own home-based sewing businesses.

The income from sales is reinvested to support more women, and moving forward, we aim to expand training, partner with local organisations, and reach more individuals—empowering them to overcome financial barriers and build a secure future.



# Project Sahaara

In the year 2024-25, Aakriti Newage Foundation successfully expanded its impact by strengthening educational infrastructure and accessibility for underserved communities. Through corporate collaborations and dedicated philanthropic efforts, we facilitated crucial resources that directly improved the learning environment and accessibility for students in tribal schools and government institutions.

Through the HPCL CSR programme, in collaboration with Korelate Learning, we successfully installed brand-new benches in primary sections where proper seating arrangements were previously inadequate. Additionally, a furniture distribution initiative was undertaken, wherein 150 school furniture units, generously provided by HPCL, were distributed across 10 primary government schools experiencing acute shortages. The impact of this initiative has been profound:

- Attendance rates increased from 55% to 68%, benefiting students of all genders.
- Reduction in cases of snake and insect bites, ensuring a safer learning space.
- Alleviation of lower back pain for students previously forced to sit on the ground while writing.

Along with this, Aakriti also received 10 brand-new ukuleles and 20+ top-quality desks for digital learning initiatives.



# Project Phaiya

Project Phaiya is an initiative aimed at enhancing mobility and accessibility for students and individuals in need. Through the generous support of **VMware**, we successfully distributed 10 bicycles and 15 wheelchairs to deserving recipients, making a significant impact on their daily lives.

The bicycles were awarded to students who demonstrated exceptional academic and extracurricular performance.

In addition, 15 wheelchairs were distributed to villagers and individuals with mobility challenges, significantly improving their quality of life. 20+ wheelchairs donated to Ashadham Ashram, ensuring mobility support for the needy and maximising the utility of these essential resources.



# Project Sabse Pehle Poshan

Hunger should never stop children from receiving an education and working towards a brighter future. The pandemic has pushed millions of people into poverty, which has particularly impacted children. Factors like poverty, lack of balanced diets, and limited support for breastfeeding have contributed to this crisis.

At Aakriti Newage Foundation, we conduct weekly drives to provide nutritious food to tribal and rural children, along with educational support, as we believe that only a healthy body can have a healthy mind. While we mainly focus on children, we also provide meals to pregnant mothers and mothers with infants in our classes, ensuring that both the present and future generations receive the nutrition they need to grow and thrive.



## Impact This Year

This year, we provided 1,500 ration kits to families in tribal areas, thanks to the generous support of individual donors. Each kit, worth ₹2,400, included essential items like wheat and corn flour (5Kg), mustard oil (3L), three types of pulses (2kg each), garam masala, turmeric, salt, sugar, and other basic items, along with ghee (0.5kg) and rice (5kg). These kits were distributed to families selected based on their financial condition and the level of malnutrition in their village, identified through thorough surveys.

In addition to the ration kits, we have also provided nutritious meals to children in tribal areas as part of our training programmes and educational drives.



# Project Dhara Shringaar

Dhara Shringaar is an environmental initiative focused on restoring the natural beauty of our planet through tree plantation, seed bombing and wildlife conservation. This project actively collaborates with various NGOs. The ultimate goal is to make the Earth more beautiful through natural and sustainable methods.

In the year 2024-25, the project planted a total of 800 native trees, with an average cost of ₹90 per tree, including the saplings and maintenance. These trees, along with smaller plants, were carefully selected to create a diverse and resilient green canopy. Additionally, over 1,000 seed bombs were distributed and thrown in open spaces around Udaipur to encourage natural forest regeneration and restore degraded lands.

Beyond just planting trees, Dhara Shringaar also focused on community engagement. More than 20 workshops were conducted in both rural and urban areas, promoting eco-printing with natural dyes.



# Kalakriti Skill Initiative

This initiative aims to empower women and girls in our community by providing them with sustainable income opportunities through creative work while also promoting environmental sustainability by repurposing used materials like glass bottles, old jeans, blankets, and woollens. Additionally, it supports the education and creative development of children by providing them with essential drawing materials. The primary beneficiaries are women and girls from nearby villages.

## Impact:

This year, a total of 1,170 used glass bottles were purchased as part of our sustainability initiative. As part of our Kalakriti project, a group of women from nearby villages received training to create stunning glass bottle art, which they later sold at local markets and fairs.

Additionally, 620 durable tote bags were crafted from high-quality old jeans, blankets, and woollens, further supporting the skills and economic empowerment of these women. Another impactful initiative involved training a group of girls in upcycled product making, where they learnt to create a range of items, from jewellery to home decor, using discarded materials.

We also distributed essential drawing materials, including crayons, drawing sheets, colours, etc.

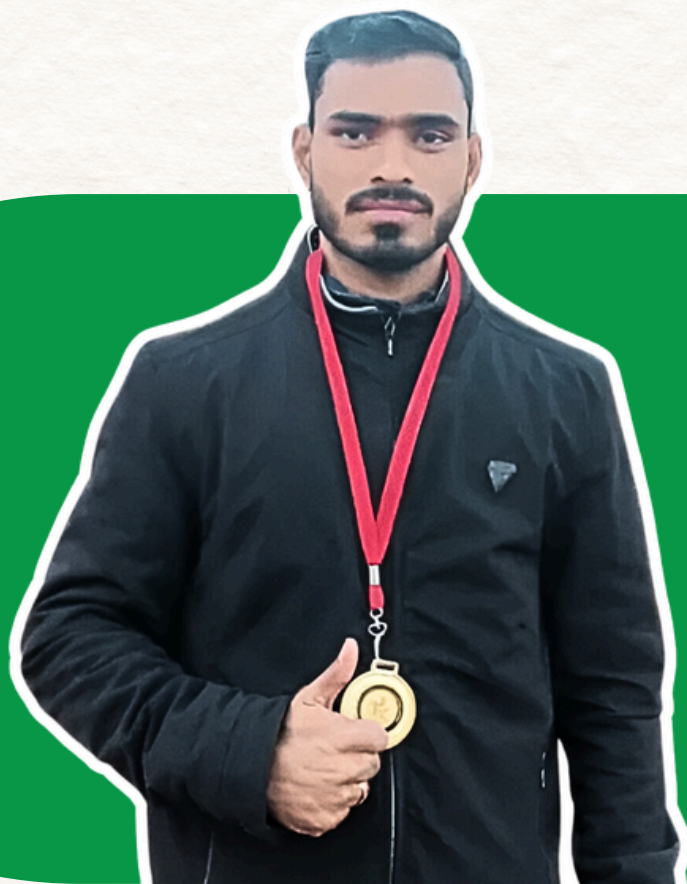
## Meet Kapil

## Meet Sonakshi

Sonakshi Pandit, a rising judo star from Udaipur, has won gold at the Sub-Junior State Judo Championship in Churu. Under the Leveling the Playing Field sports project, a CSR initiative by CaratLane and Aakriti Newage Foundation, we are proud to support her with JFI-approved judo kits. Sonakshi Sen, a rising judo player from Udaipur, is training at the Shreeji Judo Training Centre under the coaching of Sushil Sen Sir. In the past Sonakshi has won 2 silver medals in the 57kg category at the Khelo India Games women's league and a gold medal in the 70kg U17 year school state judo championship at Shri Ganganagar.



## Meet Bhavesh

Bhavesh Gameti, a 15-year-old from a rural background, has excelled in judo with the support of our “Leveling the Playing Field” project. At Coach Sushil’s request, we provided JFI-approved judo kits to Bhilu Rana School, enabling Bhavesh to compete at the state level in Sikar, where he won a silver medal and secured a spot in the nationals.

This initiative goes beyond equipment distribution—we identify and support dedicated students and teachers through in-depth surveys, ensuring resources reach the right talent.

Going forward, we aim to expand this initiative, supporting more young athletes and bridging the gap between rural and urban sporting opportunities.

## Upcoming Projects

Aakriti Newage Foundation has ambitious goals to expand its impact and reach by the end of the financial year 2025-26. These projects aim to address critical needs in education, women's empowerment, environmental sustainability, and health:

**Levelling the Playing Field** – Expanding to 250 schools by 2025 year-end, promoting sustainable sports education, organising village-level tournaments, and sponsoring talented players.

**Sui Dhaaga** – Setting up sewing centres in multiple villages with fast sewing machines to produce at least 800 bags and clothing items per day, providing livelihood opportunities to at least 100 women.

**Saksham Siksha** – Establishing digital education centres in rural areas with 35 more computers and a rented training centre to accommodate a larger number of learners, ensuring digital literacy for all.

**Dhara Shringaar** – Planting 5,000 native and fruit trees in urban spaces to reduce temperature, combat hunger, and preserve native biodiversity.

**Project NavaPathshala** – Transforming and modernising rural/tribal schools, building on the foundation of 150+ government schools already supported through CSR projects, with complete survey data available.

**Project Sakhi Sthaan** – Constructing girls' toilets in government schools, conducting menstrual hygiene awareness sessions, and installing pad vending machines to improve hygiene and safety for adolescent girls.

**Project Saksham Siksha:** 10 computers are already there. 35 more are needed, along with one rented training centre, to fulfil the need and the number of learners and to run a digital computer training centre. Rs 1,75,000. A great impact can be generated instantly.

**Project Warmth:** New sweaters and woollens are needed to be distributed to government school students in the winters of South Rajasthan. Rs. 6,00,000 (Rs. 400 per sweater). Extreme need. We have more than 100 pending requests from the government. Schools.

**Project Sui Dhagaa:** Set up and run a tailoring training centre. 4 machines are already there. Rs 60,000 per centre with machines. Support for this can speed up their livelihood generation.

**Project NavaPathshala:** School Transformation Programme. Reconstructing and modernising rural/tribal schools. Rs. 2,60,000 per school. Already worked with 150+ govt. Schools are still in the CSR project.

**Project Sakhi Sthaan:** Support for construction of girls' toilets in government schools, menstrual hygiene awareness sessions and installing pad vending machines: Rs. 1,40,000 per school. It's hard to find properly constructed toilets in 12th-grade schools even.
